





Sciences Encourage Research and Technology

Learning through experimentation was one of the key teaching methods used in the science department. Bunsen burners, microscopes, and test tubes were familiar instruments found in the classroom. Courses in chemistry, biology, physics, and physiology gave students an opportunity to gain knowledge of the modern technological world. Mr. David Barnard, chairman, supervised a staff of eleven instructors.

The math department, under the direction of Mr. James Reynolds, offered a wide selection of courses ranging from basic math to analytic geometry and calculus. Math, a science based on numbers and symbols, necessitated the use of reason and logic. Students were instructed in the use of theories, postulates, graphs, and equations in their study of mathematics.

Students studied the history of man's past in an effort to gain an understanding of the political, economic, and social aspects of life today. The range of study varied from the Neanderthal Man and ancient Greece to the "Great War" and current political campaigns. Teachers employed the use of films, maps, and tapes to enrich classroom discussions. Mrs. Pauline Holloway was chairman of the social studies department.

The foreign language department again carried on its tradition of interpretation and discovery. There were verb conjugations, endless vocabularies, recitations, and labs. Foreign literature contributed to the study of the language. The department, under the direction of Mrs. Virginia Smith, offered students a better understanding of the nations within our world.

The art department, supervised by Mr, Greer Farris, offered instruction in several areas. Sketching, painting, sculpting, and designing gave way to visual expressions of the students' imaginations. Teachers encouraged their students to use line, shape, and color effectively in class projects.

"By the Time I Get to Phoenix," "Aquarius," and "Going Out of My Head" were songs that highlighted the year for the vocal music department. Although present day music was sung for variety, chairman Mr. Bill Beck continued to use Ray Conniff music extensively. Studying theory and practicing tone were activities that occupied the class hours in all of the music courses.

A vast cultural heritage from men like Sophocles, Shakespeare, and Shaw offered students a chance to study the dramatic skills. The first year speech classes concentrated their studies on the delivery of demonstrative, extemporaneous, persuasive, and informative speeches. Debate was the major challenge in the second year course. Department chairman Mr. John Redman supervised the production of on-stage activities.

The home economics department taught a variety of useful skills from slip-stitching and bread baking to home nursing and family budgeting. Girls were given the opportunity to learn how to make a home and a life for the future. The department was organized under the leadership of Mrs. Willie Belle Hamilton.

Practical training in vocational skills was offered in the industrial arts department. Projects, completed in the workshops, required the use of special tools such as T-squares, drills, welding units, and circuit breakers. A staff of four instructors, directed by Mr. Phillip Pallissard, supervised the students' work.

Office machines, typewriters, notebooks, and pencils supplied the student with the necessary means to obtain training in the business world. Instructors in the numerous business courses prepared students for achievement in American private enterprise. The department, led by Mrs. Josephine Holland, was designed to prepare students for earning their own livings.












Before I knew it, the day of the coronation had arrived. That night, at the football game and dance, my dream seemed to be going fast, even though I tried not to think about its coming to an end.







Defensemen Rick Gambrell (80) and Steve Massey (50) arrest a loose ball in the Webster game.




Gridsters Represent Elevated Pride of Fans









As the year neared its close, elections for new officers took place. The 1969-70 Pep Club, however, left behind many improvements. A year of success remained as an example for future pep clubs.
















Coach Ed Lusk carefully blended competent individuals and saw a harmonious team emerge. His swimmers displayed the talent and finesse indicative of deserving champions.








Senior David Stephenson strokes to a first place finish.










Loyalty Night
























